

Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. <u>Copy of Birth Certificate must</u> be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This is the 5th Sunday of Lent. As we move into the last days of the season of Lent in our Gospel, we have the account of the woman caught in adultery. Jesus does not respond directly to the accusation of the elders against the sinful woman. Instead he writes a message on the dusty floor of the temple area. It is never said what Jesus began to write. Some

scholars speculate that he was writing sins in the dust: lying, cheating etc. Jesus knows that the elders are looking for reasons to arrest him.

He challenges the elders to throw a stone at her if they have no sins. Jesus' words cause an embarrassed withdrawal by the elders and those bystanders who were looking for an entertaining commotion. He does not waste time judging the woman.

She is quite aware that she has been caught in serious sin and was almost stoned to death. She owes Jesus her life. He does tell her to go and sin no more. He knows that she is aware of her sin and what it almost cost her, and so He does not waste time trying to further brow beat her with harsh words of judgment. He simply tells her to stop sinning. This is our goal for the season of Lent, to learn the ways of growing away from and when needed of rejecting sin.

The Fish Fry at Ss. Peter and Paul is this Friday, April 11th from 4:30-7:00PM. Barring unforeseen complications, the Stations of the Cross on the 11th will be in the newly restored church following the fish fry.

Thermostats



All of the 'old school' thermostats are run by pneumatics and were all leaking air, which causes the thermostats to keep calling for heat. This was keeping the rooms at about 75 degrees 24/7. They did not go down into

night mode, which is 60 degrees.

All of these thermostats have been replaced, along with new timers put in the control box. Now, the rooms are pro-grammed to only heat up to 68 degrees on Tuesdays during school at 7:00am and programmed to go down to 60 degrees at noon on Tuesdays. The rest of the week, they are set at 60 degrees when no one is using them. This is saving our parishioners money on our yearly heating expenses.

THE ALTAR OF REPOSE

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (the Triduum) are one grand liturgical action commemorating the final hours of the life of Our Lord Jesus Christ upon the earth.

We begin with the commemoration of the Last Supper and the Institution of the Eucharist, through Christ's suffering in the Garden of Gethsemane, and subsequently His arrest, His scourging, His being condemned to death, carrying the cross, and finally being crucified upon Calvary, dying, and, most importantly, rising from the dead in His resurrection.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrated on Holy Thursday evening, ends with a solemn procession of the Eucharist to an altar other than the main altar in the church, which is called the Altar of Repose, while the famous hymn, *Pante Lingua*—composed by St. Thomas Aquinas after a Eucharistic Miracle, is sung.

After the procession, we stay to spend time with our Lord in prayer as our way of being with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane that night He agonized with the Father about the impending events. We are also with Him when Judas arrives with the soldiers to arrest Him and take Him away.

You can use this time to have a deep silent exchange between your heart and the heart of God. Silence, stillness is the context.

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!

Seven Churches Pilgrimage



The Seven Churches Pilgrimage is the practice of visiting seven different churches on Holy Thursday, in imitation of the journey of Christ on the eve of his crucifixion.

The devotion is thought to have originated in sixteenth-century Rome, where pilgrims — likely led by St. Philip Neri — would visit the seven major basilicas there: St. Peter's in the Vatican, St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. Mary Major, St. Sebastian Outside the Walls, St. Lawrence Outside the Walls and Santa

Croce in Gerusalemme.

Pilgrims undertaking this journey anywhere in the world can visit any seven churches while adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament upon the Altar of Repose, fulfilling his request of his disciples to stay with him as he awaited his Passion. There are specific Scripture passages that pilgrims can meditate upon at each altar.

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Ouestion:

I haven't attended Triduum services before. What happens that's different from a normal Sunday Mass?

Answer:

The liturgies during Holy Week are unique and rich in symbolism. The Mass for Palm Sunday follows the pattern of the day 2,000 years ago when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It includes a Gospel reading outside the church building and the entrance of the priest into the sanctuary while the congregation waves palms.

The Holy Thursday Mass also follows the rhythm of the ancient Last Supper. The presider washes the feet of members of the congregation, like Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. After Mass, all remaining hosts are taken to an altar of repose, where adoration of the Blessed Sacrament occurs late into the night. Parishioners can remain like the disciples in Gethsemane, asked to "watch and pray."

On Good Friday, we celebrate another special liturgical service. Following the Liturgy of the Word, there is a communal reverencing of the cross. The intercessions are solemn and include prayers for many



different groups of people, reminding us that Jesus' passion is for the whole world. There is no Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday are distributed, after which the tabernacle is empty. The tabernacle remains empty through Holy Saturday — just as Jesus departed from this earthly world in death — and we wait in hope for Easter Sunday!
