Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

From
Fr. Jenson's
Desk



This Sunday is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Lent, the sacred season of preparation, is drawing to its close. Now we enter the most holy days of the whole Christian year. The three great days leading up to Easter Sunday, called the Triduum, are key moments in building up to the exulted celebration of the Lord's resurrection on Easter.

This weekend, we read of the Lord Jesus' final entry into Jerusalem before His arrest and crucifixion. We will read His passion at the Gospel this Sunday, and then again on Good Friday. With the first reading of the Passion on Palm Sunday, we begin keeping vigil, expectant waiting, to experience with Jesus His whole journey from the Last Supper through His arrest, journey to the cross, death, and finally glorious resurrection.

I urge you to make every effort to attend as many of the three great days leading up to Easter Sunday. They give the full richness to what is joyfully celebrated on Easter Sunday. One old tradition that is worth restoring takes place on Holy Thursday. This is the pilgrimage of the altars.

Each parish sets up an altar of repose separate from the main altar in the sanctuary. Following the end of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, it is encouraged that everyone spend some time before your parish altar of repose. After a short time there, make a pilgrimage to a few neighboring parishes to pray before their own altars of repose. This practice adds a profound depth to the beginning of the three great days. On Holy Thursday night following His arrest, Jesus was put into jail until He could be tried in the morning. Visiting altars of repose after leaving your own parish helps us get a sense of that long dark night that Jesus went through for us.

I pray that everyone in our two parishes will enter into these sacred days and encounter the wonder of what God has done for us in His Sons' death and resurrection.

Lord, [even] the king of Israel" (John 12:13). Just days later, Jesus would celebrate the Last Supper with His apostles before spending an agonizing night of prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane where He was betrayed and abandoned. Five days later, He'd die a torturous death alongside criminals.

When a reversal in fortune rattles us, we can remind ourselves that Jesus understands our anxiety. He is there for us; we can rely on Him and draw strength from His peace. And if we are experiencing a period of calm and plenty, we can help those whose circumstances are not so blessed through a gift to the Catholic Services Appeal.

THE "FOURTH CUP"

Question:

How is the "fourth cup" related to our salvation?

Answer:

To answer this question, we are going to focus on the relationship between the Last Supper and the Paschal Mystery: Jesus' Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension.

The Passover meal, as practiced by the Jewish people in Jesus' time, was structured around the drinking of four cups of wine [representing four expressions of redemption in describing the Exodus from Egypt:

1) "I will take you out..."; 2) "I will save you..."; 3) "I will redeem you..."; 4) "I will take you as a nation..."]. Now let's turn to the Last Supper, particularly as we read it in

Luke's account. It's worth taking a moment to read the text directly:

"When the hour came, He took his place at table with the apostles. He said to them, 'I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer, for, I tell you, I shall not eat it [again] until there is fulfillment in the kingdom of God.' Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and said, 'Take this and share it among

yourselves; for I tell you [that] from this time on I shall not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.' Then He took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me.' And likewise the

cup after they had eaten, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you' (Lk 22:14-20).

Luke says that "He took a cup," and later "likewise the cup after supper." This "cup after supper," the cup of His blood, was the third cup, the cup that was drunk after the meal. In fact, Paul refers to the cup of Jesus' blood explicitly as the cup of blessing, the term for the third cup.

But look at what happens next, as we see in Matthew's account: "Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, from now on I shall not drink this fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it with you new

in the kingdom of my Father.' Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives" (Mt 26:27-30).

After Jesus drinks the third cup, He says He will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom comes. So, in essence, Jesus did not actually complete the Passover meal. Instead, He goes to the Garden of

Geth-semane and prays three times to the Father that "this cup" might pass from Him (Mt 26:36-46). What cup is He referring to? The fourth cup

of the Passover meal, the final cup that concludes the meal, the one from which He did not drink.

But Jesus would drink the fourth

cup: on the cross. Let's look at John's account: "After this, aware that everything was now finished, in order that the scripture might be fulfilled, Jesus said, 'I thirst.' There was a vessel filled with common wine. So they put a sponge soaked in wine on a sprig of hyssop and put it up to his mouth. [Note, a hyssop branch is what was used to spread the blood of the lamb onto the doorposts of the Israelites on the evening of the Passover]. When Jesus had taken the wine, He said, 'It is finished.' And bowing His head, He handed over the spirit" (Jn 19:28-30).

Note: When Jesus had received the wine, He said, "It is finished." What is finished? The Last Supper. By not drinking the fourth cup until He was literally about to die, Jesus included His passion and death in the Last Supper, seeing His death as the Passover sacrifice and uniting the Last Supper to His death. Thus, by delaying the fourth cup until the cross, the cross became a Passover and the Last Supper became a sacrifice. In effect, it is the Last Supper that makes Calvary a sacrifice: both events are the same single sacrifice.

Thus, it is at the Last Supper and at its liturgical renewal in every Mass that Jesus' sacrificial death and Resurrection become present, and we are able to receive Him, the living God made flesh and present to us in the Eucharist.

But Jesus would drink the fourth cup... on the cross.

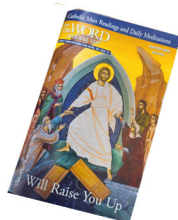

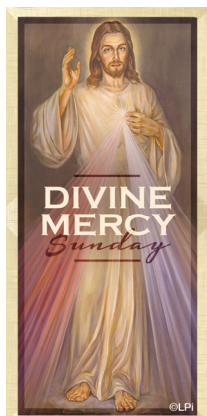
